## Proposed 3-Year Calendar

We are not proposing any changes to the previously presented 3-year calendar in the areas of:

- Start and end dates for SYs 22-23, 23-24, 24-25
- Breaks / Days Off
- Constructional Schedule


## We are proposing changes in the following areas (since BOE presentation on March 24):

- Curriculum night moved to Sept. 15 to remove Homecoming conflicts
- For SY 22-23, state optional fall testing days have been reduced to just the PSAT/NMSQT in order to recapture instructional time during the condensed construction year (MAP remains to continue fall - spring growth measurements)
- April 7, 2023 has been made a student \& staff half day (11:30 release) instead of March 24. This contractual half day is compensation for teachers working the evening of March 2 for Parent/Teacher Conferences.
- Structure of Early Release Days SY 22-23 ONLY


## Considerations when designing this proposal:

## We need a schedule that:

1. Instructional Continuity
2. Instructional Time
3. Collaboration / Professional Development Objectives
4. Cost

5. Provides consistent opportunities for teachers to develop and deliver effective lessons
6. Provides more time for students to engage in academic instruction
7. Provides sufficient time for teacher teams to work on common curriculum, assessments, and accomplish goals of the D86 Strategic Plan, notably Curriculum Alignment
8. Takes into consideration the human and financial cost to the district

## Context for SY 2022-2023

- Construction Year Schedule
- Condensed due to 'hard' start and end dates
- Strategic Plan, Goal 1, Curriculum Alignment moves to next phase(s) for each department:
- Curriculum Development Teams: English, Social Studies, Art and Music, CTE, PHD, World Languages, SPED
- Curriculum Writing Teams: All
- Proposed Early Release Schedule is a 1-year proposal...because...
- The Supt. Committee for Secondary Instructional Schedules is hard at work:
- Discussing start and end times, block vs traditional scheduling, homeroom/advisory, teacher collaboration time, student intervention time, etc...
- The work of this committee will drive both the instructional AND collaboration schedule moving forward

4. Create additional intervention opportunities for students ( $\mathrm{n}=347$ )
5. Create additional student services opportunities for students ( $\mathrm{n}=281$ )

## Scheduling / Administrative

1. Create a consistent weekly schedule ( $n=871$ )
2. Provide more time for students to sleep ( $\mathrm{n}=703$ )*
3. Create a consistent daily start time ( $\mathrm{n}=558$ )
4. Provide consistent collaboration time for teams and departments ( $\mathrm{n}=355$ )
5. Maintain a traditional lunch period ( $\mathrm{n}=252$ )*

## Deans' Perspective

Consistent start time is important:

- Significant Tardy Issues on Late Start Days
- Bus routes take longer on Late Start Days (in conflict with parent drop off at sender schools)
- Goal 2 Strategic Plan Team and Superintendent's Secondary Instructional Schedule Committee is studying additional benefits (e.g. consistent later start for more sleep)

## Option 1 - Continue with Same LS/Flex Day Schedule

## Benefits:

- Use a familiar schedule while the Secondary Instructional Schedule Committee continues its work (BOE update and potential recommendation scheduled for June)
- Instructional time increases by 2 hours
- No loss of food service revenue
- Building specific course teams have more frequent opportunities for collaboration meetings (LS days)


## Challenges:

- Class minutes remain uneven on 17 LS days (difference of 15 minutes per class)
- Flex Day class periods remain at 25 minutes
- Tardy and bus concerns persist
- Students consistently pulled from class for intervention and academic/student services
- Limited time for District collaboration toward alignment goals - likely requiring more pull out days

## Option 2: Modified Early Release Proposal - SY 22-23

## Highlights:

- Bi-Monthly Early Release days $\square$
- 15 Scheduled Early Release days with 12:35 dismissal
- Removed all other collaboration days
- On Early Dismissal days, all classes 35 minutes long (no uneven class lengths)


## Modifications from initial proposal:

- Removed 15 collaboration days
- Increased remaining collaboration time by 25 minutes/day
- Would still require an HHSTA agreement to alter existing contractual release time

## Option 2 - Shift to a Modified Early Release Schedule

## Benefits for Students:

- Increased instructional time
- (8 hours for SY 22-23)
- Consistent start time
- Consistent class length
- Increased class length on ER Wednesdays
- Support Services (Academic and SEL) available twice a month without missing class
- Teacher pull out from class reduced


## Benefits for Staff:

- One plan for each class
- Sufficient collaboration time for in-building AND cross-district meetings


## Challenges:

- Estimated loss of food service revenue: \$45,000
- Worth noting that pausing PSAT fall testing saves D86 approx. \$40,000 in assessment fees to the College Board
- Transportation back to campus for afternoon/evening athletics/activities

## What are Student Options on an Early Release Day?

- Go home (full bus routes depart approx. 10 minutes after the last bell)

OR - Because students are already at school the following are opportunities for students:

- Quiet Study or Homework Space
- Group work for class projects; student leadership planning time
- Test Make Up Center (missed test, extended time, reassessment)
- Meet with Counselor, Social Worker, Group (without being pulled from class)
- Down time before afternoon practice (athletics facilities open and supervised)
- Looking to gather student interest in organizing an intramurals system
- Note: Based on the level of intervention/remediation needed, some students will be expected to stay during this time
* Grab and Go food will be available for all students on ER Wednesdays
* Second bus route available for students who choose to stay


## District 86 Recommendation

Shift to the proposed Modified Early Release Wednesday Schedule for SY 22-23 Major Rationale:

- More instructional time
- More consistent class time (duration and frequency)
- More opportunity for District collaboration (without teacher pull out)
- More identified academic support and resource opportunities
